

## Ordinance 2000- 6

### An Ordinance Regulating Solicitation Within the Village of South Point

*Whereas*, the South Point Village Council deems it necessary to establish regulations concerning the solicitation of contributions and donations from Village residents and businesses.

*Now, Therefore Be It Ordained, that*, any person, business or organization wishing to solicit contributions, donations or sell products or services door to door within the Village of South Point, Ohio, must comply with the following:

Section 1. A permit must be obtained at the Mayor's Office before any solicitation campaign shall begin. The permit shall be free of charge, but the following items must be completed before a permit will be issued.

A. The name, phone number and address of the company or organization and the person responsible for the solicitation campaign.

B. A copy of each pitch sheet or solicitation script used during the solicitation campaign.

C. A full description of the purpose for which the solicitation campaign is being carried out.

D. The exact dates when the campaign will begin and end.

Section 2. Any professional solicitation company or organization operating in the State of Ohio is governed by Chapter 1716 of the Ohio Revised Code.


Section 3. The Mayor or Administrator are authorized to grant a solicitation permit and notify the Chief of Police of the campaign.


Section 4. Whoever violates or fails to comply with the provisions of this ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$100.00 for each offense. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which a violation or noncompliance occurs or continues.

Section 5. Any legislation in conflict herewith be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance is for the protection of the public health safety and welfare of the Village and therefore this ordinance shall take effect upon the approval of the third reading by a majority vote of Council and the earliest period allowed by law.
