

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance 08-12 Stating
 Maximum Fines for Traffic Offenses Within The
 Limits of the Village of South Point in Accordance
 With The Ohio Revised Code and Declaring an Emergency

Be It Ordained by the South Point Village Council, that:

SECTION 1: The following fines will be charged in addition to state and local court costs.

SECTION 2: Any offense not stated in this ordinance will be governed by the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3: This ordinance will supersede any and all previous ordinances pertaining to fines and costs.

SECTION 4: Court Costs for South Point Mayor's Court shall be \$51.00
PLUS any State of Ohio mandated costs
PLUS \$10.00 computer fee established by ordinance 10-04
IN ADDITION to the following fines:



Ordinance 10-04

An Ordinance Establishing the Mayor's Court
Computer Fund, Setting The Computer Fee
and Declaring An Emergency

Whereas, Ohio Revised Code 1901.261 allows for the establishment of a Mayor's Court Computer Fund as a special revenue fund; and

Whereas, the Village is in need of purchasing computer equipment and software to maintain the Mayor's Court operations.


Now, Therefore Be It Ordained by the South Point Village Council, that:

Section 1: In accordance with O.R.C. 1901.261 the Mayor's Court Computer Fund is hereby established. The current computer fee balance of \$5,075.90 being accounted for within the General Fund is hereby transferred to the Mayor's Court Computer Fund.

Section 2: In accordance with O.R.C. 1901.261(B)(1) an additional fee of \$10.00 for each case shall be collected and deposited to the Mayor's Court Computer Fund for the purpose of procuring and maintaining computer systems for the court.

Section 3: This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall go into effect the earliest time allowed by law. An legislation in conflict with this ordinance including ordinance 00-03 is hereby repealed.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved that: the South Point Village Council hereby approves the following additional charges on certain cases when needed for the Mayor's Court.


Section 1:	Returned Check Fee	\$20.00

	Background Check	\$20.00
	Police Report Copy (Incident, Crash, etc)	\$20.00*

Section 2: All fees collected shall be deposited to the General Fund along with the regular court costs and fines.

Section 3: This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption by a majority vote of Council and shall be effective beginning August 2, 2011.
